RATs are important and effective

Rapid Antigen Tests (commonly known as RATs) remain a very important tool in managing COVID-19 in our everyday lives. Here's a few points to consider when using RATs:

- RATs are a quick and accurate way to test for the virus that causes COVID-19. These tests continue to detect the current variants circulating in Victoria.
- If you are symptomatic or a close or social contact, it is important to repeat rapid antigen tests over several days to increase the chance of detecting COVID-19 infection.
- Early on in a COVID-19 infection when virus levels are still low, a RAT may not be detect COVID-19 but you may still be infectious.
- Once you have a positive result, you have COVID-19 and should begin your seven (7) days isolation.
- If you have symptoms but test negative for COVID-19, you may have developed another respiratory infection. Please stay home until you are well again to help stop the spread of infectious diseases in our communities.
