Concern over new COVID-19 infections in Victoria

Health authorities are warning COVID-19 infections could rise significantly over coming weeks as the Omicron BA.4/BA.5 strain spreads through the community. The Department of Health anticipates the prevalence of BA.4/BA.5 in Victoria is likely to result in an increase in cases - including reinfections - and hospital admissions and deaths. This is because the strain has a greater ability than the previous BA.2 strain to evade immunity provided by vaccination and earlier COVID-19 infection. - Improve ventilation by opening doors and windows, using fans or purifiers, and gathering outside where possible.
