Changes to isolation times

From Friday, September 9 people who have tested positive for COVID-19 will only need to isolate for five days instead of seven days. However, there are exceptions to the new rule: if you are symptomatic or work in a high-risk setting such as aged care, you will still have to isolate for seven days.

Safely visiting aged care

A reminder people are welcome to visit residents in our aged care communities, however visitors must:

- have a negative result from a rapid antigen test (RAT) on the day of the visit, or a PCR test within 24 hours prior to the visit; and
- wear a mask during the visit.
