Changes to isolation times

Required isolation periods for COVID-19 positive cases have been reduced under recent changes to health orders. The required isolation period has reduced from 7 to 5 days following a positive test if you have no symptoms on Day 5. People who work in high risk settings such as aged care can leave isolation after Day 5 but cannot return to work until after Day 7. This requirement is to minimise the spread of COVID-19 in aged care settings. Find out more at www.coronavirus.vic.gov.au
