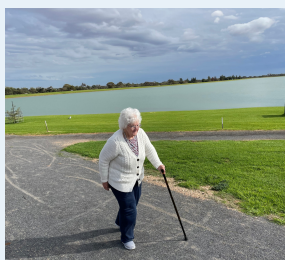

Quality, Safety and Risk System Manager

Certificate III in Individual Support - Ageing, Home & Community

Interested community members are encouraged to apply to complete Certificate III in Individual Support - Ageing, Home & Community - CHC33015 through our local Reach Out Rural Learning Hub. The course can be completed in six months, combining work, on the job training and structured learning. This entry level course is for people who may want to change careers, leave school, mature age or just want a career in health supporting older people at home or in a residential aged care setting.
